Some thoughts to help you . . .

Along Your Journey in Faith

October is traditionally known as the month of the rosary with the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary celebrated on October 7.

The rosary traces its origin to those who wanted to imitate the monks' daily psalm prayers but could not memorize the psalms. Instead, they began using familiar prayers. As time passed, the 150 psalms were replaced with three sets of five mysteries – Joyful, Sorrowful, and Glorious. The rosary pattern then added an Our Father to begin each of the five decades with ten Hail Marys and ending with a Glory Be. Thus, the 150 psalms were replaced with 150 well-known prayers that ordinary Catholics could easily pray.

On November 21, 1973, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops commented on the rosary in their pastoral letter on Mary, *Behold Your Mother: Woman of Faith*. They reminded Catholics that the rosary's importance stemmed not from reciting prayers but from time spent reflecting on the mysteries.

Rosary prayer times can have "an instructive use of readings from the Old Testament as well as New. . ." along with hymns and "time periods of silent prayer." Some Catholics have developed mysteries for various occasions such as a rosary for the sick.

Many Catholics are probably not even aware that another set of mysteries were added to the rosary. Pope John Paul II, on October 16, 2002, introduced the Luminous Mysteries based on significant events in the Jesus' public ministry. They include:

- The Baptism of Jesus
- The Wedding Feast at Cana
- The Proclamation of the Kingdom
- The Transfiguration
- The Institution of the Eucharist

The rosary is prayed each Sunday morning throughout the year at St. Therese prior to the 8:30 Mass. One parishioner told me that she prays the rosary daily. Well, she starts it, but often she herself doesn't finish. Instead, she tells her guardian angel to finish it for her. Not a bad idea!

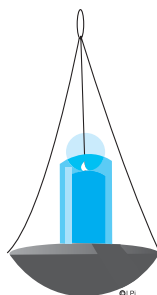

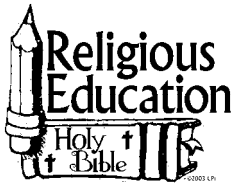
