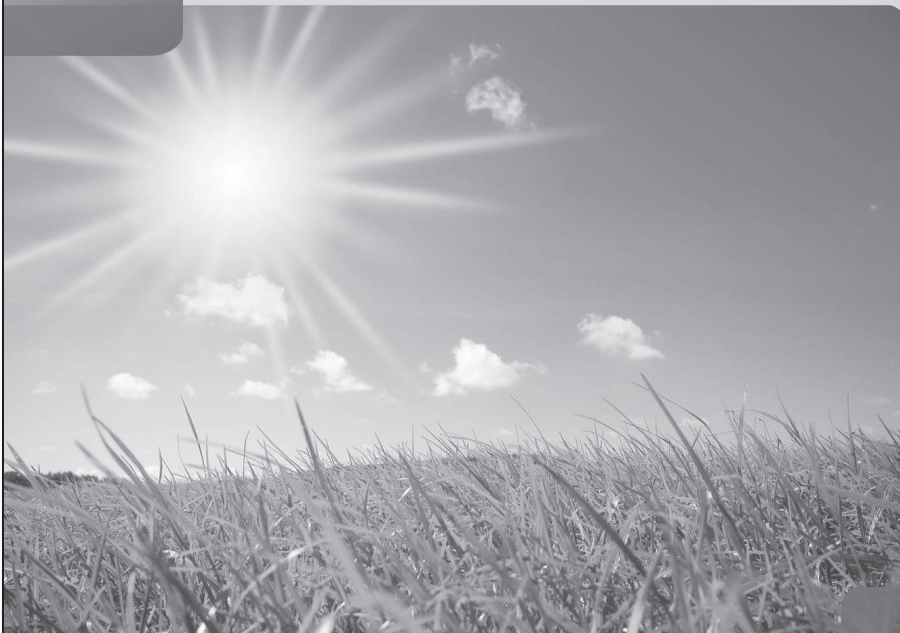

Guide to the Catechism of the Catholic Church

Stop the Killing

Article #54

“God alone is master of life from its beginning to its end,” Catechism, 2258.

British gentlemen, veterans of Queen Victoria’s “little wars,” were fond of greeting one another with the words, “Did you have a good war?” Benjamin Franklin, that most artful of diplomats, would have shaken his head and told them, There has never been a good war or a bad peace.” After the Fall of Adam and Eve, the very first act recorded in Scripture is Cain’s murder of Abel. The destruction of human life is the first result of Original Sin. God condemned the act, “Your brother’s blood cries to me from the soil” (Gn 4:11). God opposes the deliberate and malicious killing of human life: “You shall not kill” (Dt 5:17).

Preservation of Life and the Common Good

At the same time legitimate self-defense is permitted, both to save one’s life and to preserve the common good of the community. The catechism outlines the principles for self-defense in paragraphs 2263-2267. The principles for peace and war and the strict guidelines for “legitimate defense by military force” are found in paragraphs 2302-2317. The emphasis, however, is on the aggressive pursuit of peace and avoidance of war. Matters that lead to war should be eliminated: hatred, anger, revenge, massive buildup of armies, and economies based on weapons production.

A Voice on the Behalf of Life

Other deeds opposed by this Commandment are: suicide, abortion, euthanasia, infanticide, terrorism, genocide, and assassination. “Suicide is contrary to the love of self...neighbor...God. Grave psychological troubles, anxieties or suffering resulting from torture can diminish the responsibility of the suicidal person. Voluntary cooperation with a suicide is against the moral law” (2281-2282). The catechism has a powerful section about the immorality of abortion (see 2270-2275): “The inalienable right to life of every innocent, individual human is a constituent element of society and its legislation” (2273). The catechism is also very clear about the immorality of euthanasia: “Those whose life is fading or enfeebled deserve a special respect. Direct euthanasia terminates the lives of sick, dying and handicapped persons. It is morally unacceptable” (Catechism, 2276-2277). At the same time, the catechism repeats the traditional teaching of the Church that one need not use extraordinary means to stay—or keep—someone alive. The Magisterium of the Church has never declared capital punishment to be a sin, but, increasingly, various Popes and bishops are calling for its abolishment. In these many life-and-death issues, the Church has been a clear voice on behalf of life. In a century that has seen the worst wars in history, death camps, legal promotion of abortion (and now, euthanasia), the courageous stand of the Church on the side of life is a sign of hope for human dignity and a summons to societies to wake up their moral consciences.

Reflection

1. *What is the Church’s teaching about killing?*

You shall not kill” (Dt 5:17). All human life from human conception until death is sacred because the human person has been created in the image and likeness of the living and holy God (Catechism, 219).

2. *What are some sins forbidden by the Fifth Commandment?*

Murder, direct and intended abortion, euthanasia, suicide (Catechism, 2320, 2322, 2324, 2325).

3. *What does the Church say about war?*

Because of the many evils and injustices which war produces, we should do all we can to use every reasonable effort to avoid it. The Church and human reason affirm the permanent validity of the moral law during armed conflict. Practices deliberately contrary to the right of a nation or its universal principles are crimes (Catechism, 2327, 2328).

Prayer

From hatred and war, deliver us, O Lord. From abortion, murder, euthanasia and suicide, deliver us, O Lord.

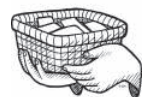
ST JAMES SOUP AND CHILI COOK OFF
