

OUR PARISH MISSION



Fr. Brian Mullady, O.P.
to speak at
St. Therese Church
Monday & Tuesday,
April 17-18, 7pm:



Dominican priest Fr. Brian Mullady, O.P., is a world-renowned scholar who has taught in many colleges and seminaries in Rome and the United States. He is also well known for having appeared many years on Mother Angelica's EWTN television network, where he taught twelve series of courses. He currently is featured on Relevant Radio where he answers questions on the Catholic Faith.

Fr. Mullady preached our parish mission at St. Therese in 2018. We are thrilled to have him back for two evenings.

On **Monday, April 17** at **7pm** Fr. Mullady will explain the Church's teaching on end-of-life issues, such as: ordinary v. extraordinary care for those sick and dying, the moral obligation to provide basic care (e.g., nutrition and hydration), the value of having a durable power of attorney to assure that end-of-life decisions are made that are in keeping with the Church's moral teachings. These issues are extremely important in our day, when often people who are near the end of life are not given the care they need and deserve.

On **Tuesday, April 18** at **7pm** Fr. Mullady will speak on the great Mystery of our Faith, the Most Holy Eucharist. The U.S. Bishops have called for a multi-year program to revive faith in and devotion to the Eucharist. Fr. Mullady will speak to us on the mystery of the real, substantial Presence of Jesus - Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity, in order to help deepen our love and devotion to Our Eucharistic Lord.

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY: This Sunday, April 16:

In the 1930's Jesus appeared many times to a Polish nun, Sr. Faustina Kowalska, and revealed that He desires to pour out His mercy on souls. Jesus appeared with white and red rays emitting from His



Heart, to symbolize the mercy which has continually flowed from His Sacred Heart pierced after death, when water and blood flowed forth. He told Sister Faustina that He wanted an image painted with the words, "Jesus, I Trust in You" to let sinners know they should not fear but rather trust in the infinite mercy of God.

Jesus also told Sister Faustina that He wanted the Sunday after Easter to be celebrated as the feast of Divine Mercy. (This Sunday the Gospel reading from John ch. 20 recounts the institution of the Sacrament of Penance by Jesus with the words, "Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them".) Our Lord told Sister Faustina, "On that day, the very depths of my tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole



ocean of graces upon the souls who approach the fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession [within eight days of Mercy Sunday] and receive Holy Communion [on this day] shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment."

Jesus promised a "complete forgiveness of sin and punishment" due to sin for those who confess their sins, and who receive Holy Communion on Divine Mercy Sunday. This is likened to getting baptized over again, since baptism not only washes away all sins, but remits all punishment due to sins as well. If someone dies after having all the punishment for their sins forgiven, there is no need for any purification after death in Purgatory; that person goes directly to Heaven. What a wonderful outpouring of divine mercy!
