CONGRESS INTRODUCES PERSONHOOD LEGISLATION

The Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization U.S. Supreme Court ruling in June 2022 remanded the abortion issue back to the state legislatures and the Congress to be democratically addressed by the people's representatives. Accordingly, the 118th U.S. Congress has introduced legislation that protects the preborn child as a legal person. Offering a national solution to the atrocity of abortion, the legislation applies 14th Amendment protections to all human beings from conception.

On January 20, 2022, U.S. Representative Alexander Mooney (R-WV) introduced House Resolution (H.R.) 431, the Life at Conception Act, to implement equal protection under the 14th Amendment to the United States Constitution for the right to life of each born and preborn human person. It has so far been co-sponsored by seventythree representatives, including Rep. Scott Fitzgerald (R-WI), and has been referred to the Committee on the Judiciary. H.R. 431 does the following:

1) Implement(s) equal protection for the right to life of each born and preborn human person, and pursuant to the duty and authority

of the Congress, including Congress' power under article I, section 8, to make necessary and proper laws, and Congress' power under section 5 of the 14th article of amendment to the Constitution of the United States, the Congress hereby declares that the right to life guaranteed by the Constitution is vested in each human being;

2) Defines "human person" and "human being" to include each and every member of the species homo sapiens at all stages of life, including the moment of fertilization, cloning, or other moment at which an individual member of the human species comes into being; and



3) Includes the District of Columbia, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, and each other territory or possession of the United States in [...] (t)he term "State" used in the 14th article of amendment to the Constitution of the United States and other applicable provisions of the Constitution.

The Life at Conception Act is one of the most comprehensive pro-life bills ever introduced by the U.S. Congress. Through H.R. 431, Congress would establish personhood from the moment of conception to extend the equal protection and due process rights of our federal constitution to all human beings from the

> beginning of their lives. Establishing personhood would legally recognize the preborn child as a United States citizen at every stage of development and thus protect him or her against any physical harm, such as from surgical abortion, chemical abortion, embryo destructive research, research cloning, or other violent attack. Put simply, **the Life at Conception Act would fully protect every preborn human being from his or her beginning without exception.**

Americans, born and preborn, deserve total and permanent legal protection of their inalienable and inviolable right to life. With the *Dobbs* decision clearing the way, NOW is the time to enshrine the personhood of each preborn child in

federal law. Legal abortion, defined as the intentional destruction of a living preborn human being, cannot be tolerated in any state or jurisdiction in America. It leaves a bloody stain on our entire nation wherever it is permitted.

Former President Ronald Reagan, in his 1988 National Sanctity of Human Life Day proclamation, said it best:

"Our nation cannot continue down the path of abortion, so radically at odds with our history, our heritage, and our concepts of justice. This sacred legacy, and the well-being and the future of our country, demand that protection of the innocents must be guaranteed and that the personhood of the unborn be declared and defended throughout our land."
