

July 16, 2023 Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The Feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel & the Brown Scapular

The religious order which is dedicated under the patronage of Our Lady of Mount Carmel traces its roots to the ninth century B.C. In Palestine, on Mount Carmel which overlooks the Mediterranean Sea, the prophet Elijah successfully challenged the pagan priests of Baal and won the people to the true God. Elijah's successor was the Prophet Elisha. The followers of these two great prophets lived on Mount Carmel as hermits in the succeeding centuries, awaiting the coming of Christ. On first Pentecost, these hermits were among the first few thousand to be baptized.

Carmelite monks continued to live on Mount Carmel, and the community built a monastery and church dedicated to the Virgin Mary on Mount Carmel in 1263. Saint Louis, King of France, had visited Mount Carmel in 1254, and brought back six French hermits for whom he built a convent near Paris. In the 13th century Muslims invaded and the Carmelites fled to Europe.

The Feast & the Brown Scapular: On **July 16, 1251**, Our Lady appeared to St. Simon Stock, the Superior-General of the Carmelite Order (1247-1265), and presented him with the Brown Scapular with the following promise: "*Receive, My beloved son, this habit of thy order: this shall be to thee and to all Carmelites a privilege, that whosoever dies clothed in this shall never suffer eternal fire It shall be a sign of salvation, a protection in danger, and a pledge of peace." The feast day (July 16) was set in the 14th century.*

In order to receive the spiritual blessings associated with the Scapular, it is necessary to be formally enrolled in the Brown Scapular. The enrollment is made only once by a priest or authorized person. The Scapular can be replaced afterwards by a medal, which has on one side the image of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and on the other, the image of Mary.

Popes and Saints have strongly urged the faithful to wear the Brown Scapular. In 1950, Pope Pius XII wrote these famous words regarding the Brown Scapular: "*Let it be your sign of consecration to the immaculate heart of Mary, which we are particularly urging in these perilous times.*" And in 2001, Pope St. John Paul II called the Brown Scapular "*the most genuine form of devotion to the Blessed Virgin, a humble sign of consecration to her Immaculate Heart.*"

The Brown Scapular is not a sacrament (which bestows grace), but rather is a sacramental which disposes those who wear it devoutly to receive grace. And as Popes have taught, it is a sign of authentic devotion to Our Lady, especially of consecration to her Immaculate Heart, to assist those who wear it in imitating the Blessed Virgin Mary: her virtues, especially her love for God and others; and her readiness always to doing God's will in all things.

The United Hearts of Jesus & Mary

"The Blessed Virgin is, without doubt, a perfect copy of her Son. No resemblance can be greater than that which exists between the Sacred Hearts of Mother and Son. Never were two Hearts more



like to each other than those of Jesus and Mary. The Heart of Jesus was the most tender of all hearts; we can say the same to a proportion-ate extent of the Heart of Mary; the tenderness of any other in no way approaches it. Jesus Christ gave this command to His disciples, 'Learn of Me, because I am meek and humble of heart.' If anyone has ever thoroughly learned this lesson, it is the Blessed Virgin who has done so—she, the perfect disciple of her Son—she, who for thirty years had continually before her eyes this Divine model of meekness and humility." Fr.
