

### Prayer to Our Lady of the Precious Blood

O Virgin Mary, through the overshadowing of the Holy Spirit, Thou didst give a human nature to Thy Divine Son without which He could not have suffered and redeemed. On His eighth day, Thou didst bring Him to the temple for His first anxious bloodshedding in anticipation of His Cross.

At Cana, Thou didst send Him to His Hour of Redemption by asking Him to begin His public life by working His first Miracle; at the Cross, Thou didst stand as an active participant of His Redemption and Thou didst hear thyself called to be the mother of men, as, at Bethlehem, Thou wast called in the Visitation to be called the Mother of God.

When Thy Divine Son was taken down from the Cross and laid in Your arms as a Paten, though Thou were not a priest, Thou couldst say, as no priest has said, the words of consecration: "This is My Body; this is My Blood." Thus, the chalice which He drank and the bread which He offered were prepared by you as the Divine Sacristan of love.

Grant that, through the shedding of His Blood, we shed no more blood of our brothers in war. Without the shedding of blood, there is no remission of sins, but may all of the sins of the world be remitted through the blood of Him for Whom Thou wert the ciborium of the flesh during nine months and His Mother and ours through time and eternity. Amen.

Instructor: Fr. Dwight P. Campbell

Basic Text: Basic Catholic Catechism Course by Fr. John Hardon, S.J., cost: \$25, cash or check payable to OLMC Church, which you may bring to the class the first evening. \*Non-Catholics who are part of the RCIA (Right of Christian Initiation for Adults) receive the book free of charge.

Basic Summary: This course will be a year-long, complete tour the Catholic Faith. The course is open to anyone — adults or teens — to gain a better understanding of the Catholic Faith. It is also an RCIA course: any non-Catholic who is interested in looking into the Catholic Faith is invited to attend. Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) Adults or children interested in baptism, reception into the Catholic Church, Confirmation and/or First Communion, please contact the Parish Office.

**Baptism** Please call the Parish Office to arrange for Baptism. Those who wish to have a child baptized must be attending Sunday Mass regularly for at least four months.

**Marriage** Please call the Pastor at least six months in advance to make arrangements. Couples who are sharing the same abode will be asked to live separately prior to their marriage.

**Home Visitation** Anyone unable to attend Mass because of sickness/old age, contact the Parish Office.
