

The Rosary Confraternity

Pope Leo XIII published sixteen encyclicals and apostolic letters on the topic of the rosary, and is therefore rightly called "the Pope of the Rosary." Writing over a hundred years ago, and lamenting the tendency toward secularism, the Holy Father commented on the fact that many Catholic associations of prayer were fruitful in uniting the faithful by the bond of Christian charity. After enumerating various types of associations he stated: "We do not hesitate to assign a pre-eminent place among these societies to that known as the Confraternity of the Holy Rosary." (Encyclical Augustissimae Virginis Mariae)

The Rosary Confraternity is a worldwide Association of the Faithful who pledge themselves to pray the full Rosary of fifteen mysteries at least once during the course of each week. Anyone who prays a third of the Rosary each day, already fulfills the main obligation for membership in the Confraternity. In addition to the weekly fifteen mysteries of the Rosary, each member, through a general intention, includes the intentions and welfare of all the Confraternity members throughout the world in each Rosary prayed. That means, in turn, that each one enrolled in the Confraternity and his intentions are remembered in the Rosaries of hundreds of thousands of Confraternity members throughout the world.

The same Holy Father, in his Apostolic Constitution "Ubi Primum," spoke of this fraternal aspect of the Confraternity as follows: "The end for which the Confraternity of the Holy Rosary

has been instituted is that many being banded in fraternal charity by that most devotional form of prayer from which the Confraternity takes its name, may be drawn to praise and honor the Blessed Virgin, and by unanimous supplication secure her patronage."

Membership Obligations

The obligations of the Confraternity do not bind under pain of sin, that is, one does not sin if he fails to pray the fifteen

mysteries of the Rosary during the course of the week. A deliberate neglect of this obligation, however, could cause one not to share in the fruits of membership. If, however, one through sickness or some other legitimate cause fails to recite the full Rosary during the week, he would not lose the spiritual fruits that enrollment

Membership in the Confraternity brings one a wonderful sense of security, a sense of being one with countless unknown members throughout the world

who include other members and their intentions in their prayers. It brings a sense of being brought under the protective mantle of the Mother of God, who has pleaded so often for the recitation of the Rosary, that devotion centers one's attention and prayerful reflections on the Joyful, Sorrowful and Glorious Mysteries of Mary's life and those of her Divine Son. It brings a sense of being happily bound together by the chain of the Rosary with countless other devotees of the Mother of God, seeking to fulfill her requests for the conversion of sinners and in reparation for sins committed against the divine majesty.

The Rosary is Our Lady's gift to the Church. She understands our weaknesses and the many temptations and trials which we encounter. If prayed devoutly, the Rosary is specially tailored to

help us meet those challenges, for it helps us to see them in the light of the Cross and trials of her Divine Son. Prayed in this way, the Rosary brings the light and strength needed to meet and conquer the challenges of life.

One final condition of membership is that one's name be inscribed in the register of the Confraternity. This may be done at the Rosary Center, P.O. Box 3617, Portland, Oregon, 97208, www.rosary

Pope Pius XII: 1951 Encyclical on Importance of Praying the Holy Rosary (*Ingruentium Malorum*)

"It is above all in the bosom of the family that We desire the custom of the Holy Rosary to be everywhere adopted, religiously preserved, and ever more intensely practiced. In vain is a remedy sought for the wavering fate of civil life, if the family, the principle and foundation of the human community, is not fashioned after the pattern of the Gospel. To undertake such a difficult duty, We affirm that the custom of the family Rosary is a most efficacious means.

"We do not hesitate to affirm again publicly that We put great confidence in the Holy Rosary for the healing of evils which afflict our times."
