

### **Rosary Crusade Pledge and Prayer**

In this critical time, when Holy Mother Church faces what many believe to be the most dangerous attacks ever on its perennial moral and doctrinal teachings, in deed, even on its hierarchical structure as instituted by Jesus Christ on Peter and the Apostles; and knowing that over the centuries the Catholic faithful have obtained great victories by praying the Holy Rosary\* and appealing to the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of God and Help of Christians, for her heavenly aid, who at Fatima exhorted us to "pray the Rosary every day"; I pledge to pray daily, five decades of the Rosary, along with the following prayer:

O Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Divine Savior and Mother of the Church which Christ founded as a hierarchy on Peter and the Apostles, we beg you to intercede with your divine Spouse, the Holy Spirit, that the Pope, bishops, priests and laity may faithfully adhere to the teaching handed down by the Church throughout the centuries under the guidance of the same Holy Spirit. Queen of Heaven and earth, whose power and scope of offices is "impossible to measure," given that God has placed in your hands power that is "all but unlimited,"\*\* we beg you to intercede before the throne of your Son, Jesus Christ, our King and our Lord, that any and all plots to undermine the sacred Deposit of Faith, the revealed word of God found in Sacred Scripture and Sacred Tradition, may be exposed and defeated; and that you, who destroy all heresies and crush the head of the evil serpent (cf. Gen 3:15), may render powerless the insidious machinations of the Devil and all his minions in any and all attacks against Holy Mother Church. We ask this through your Sorrowful and Immaculate Heart, which is the gateway to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, and in union with the Most Pure Heart of St. Joseph, Patron of the Church Universal. Amen.

\* At the Battle of Muret (1213), Simon de Montfort and his troops defeated the Albigensians; and at the Battle of Lepanto (1571), under Don Juan of Austria, and again at the Battle of Vienna (1683), under King Jan Sobieski of Poland, the Muslim Turks were defeated. In all three victories the Catholic forces, along with the faithful, prayed the Rosary. In 1955, after the faithful in Austria participated in a Rosary Crusade, the atheistic communist Soviet forces – unexplainably – left the country. After similar Rosary Crusades in Brazil (1964) and Portugal (1974), atheistic communist regimes in power fell.
