Did you lift Him up, sometimes Gently on your knee? Did you sing to Him the way Mother does to me?


Did you hold His hand at night Did you ever try Telling Him stories of the world? O, and did He cry?

ADORERS NEEDED for EUCHARISTIC ADORATION!

We would like to have at least two people present for every hour that Our Lord in the Eucharist is exposed on the altar:

Fridays 9am (following Mass & Rosary) until 5pm; and First Fridays/
Saturdays Friday 9am, throughout the day, evening, through early Saturday morning until 6am. There is a sign-up board on the right as you enter the church with hours listed. Please consider committing to an hour on Fridays, and on 1st Fridays/Saturdays (esp. late night/early morning), to spend time alone with Jesus.

Mass Schedule: 4th Sunday Advent & Christmas: BOTH are Obligatory

This year the *Fourth Sunday of Advent* falls on the same day as Christmas Eve, with *Christmas Day* on Monday. The obligation to attend Mass on the Fourth Sunday of Advent <u>and</u> on Christmas still stands. Because people may have questions about how to fulfill both obligations, below are **four options**. The important thing to remember is that no matter which option is chosen, **the two obligations must be fulfilled separately**:

Option 1 – Saturday Eve Dec. 23rd 4th Sunday of Advent 4pm & Sunday Dec. 24 at 4pm Christmas Eve or 10pm Option 2 – Saturday Eve Dec. 23rd 4th Sunday of Advent 4pm & Monday Dec. 25 8:30am or 10:30am Christmas Day

Option 3 – Sunday Dec. 24 at 8:30am or 10:30am 4th Sunday Advent & Sunday Dec. 24 at 4pm & 10pm Christmas Eve

Option 4 – Sunday Dec. 24 at 8:30am or 10:30am 4th Sunday Advent & Monday Dec. 25 at 8:30am or 10:30am Christmas Day
