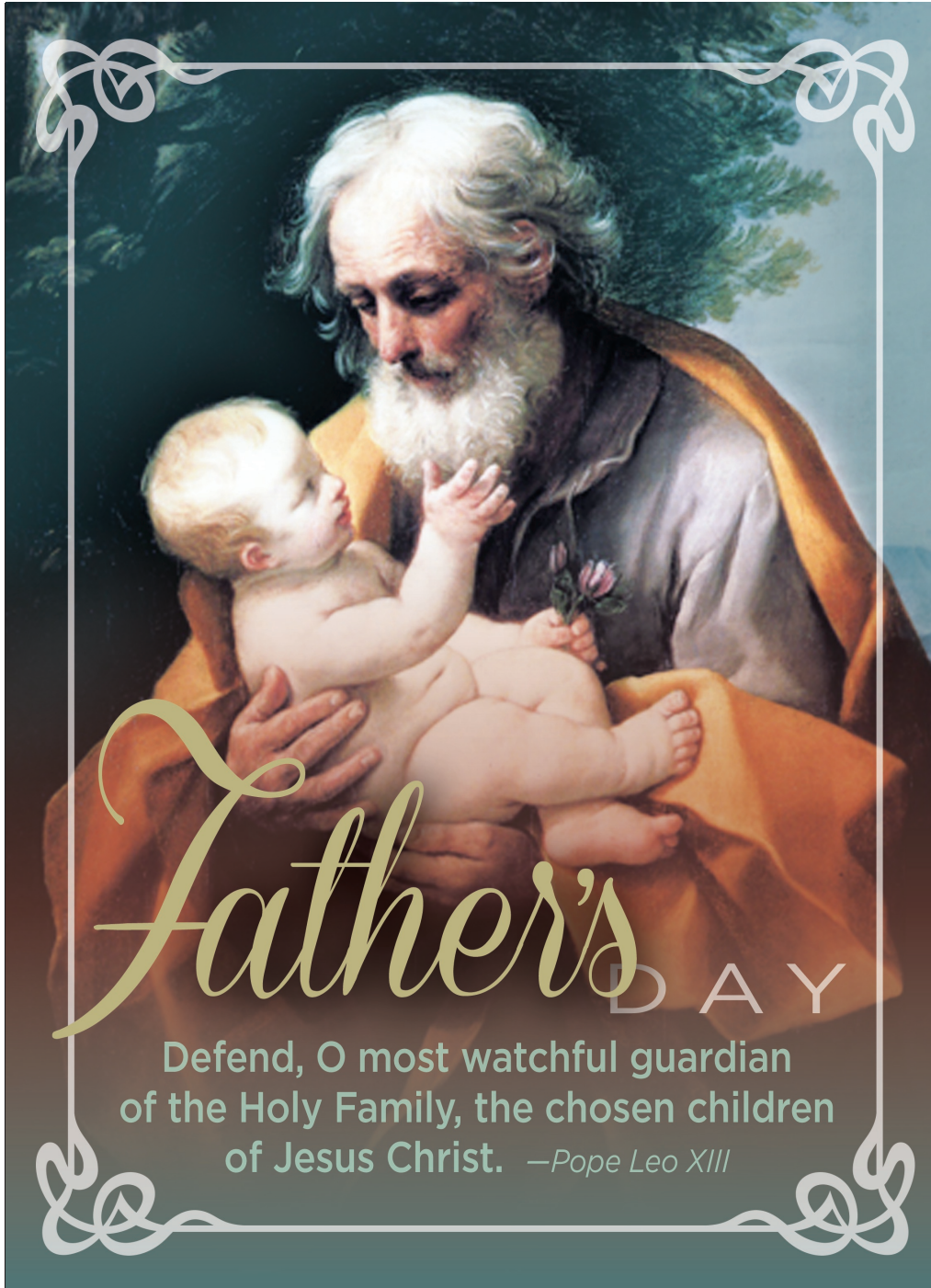

12-Day Pilgrimage to the Holy Land

Leave Sunday eve. Oct. 20 O'Hare Airport; return Thurs. Oct. 31

Travel Arrangements by: **Holy Land Travel Center**; Led by Fr. Dwight P. Campbell, S.T.D.
\$3,699 incl. flights, hotels, 2 meals a day (breakfast/dinner), ground travel

Daily Itinerary

Day 1 (Sun. evening Oct. 20): Depart USA from O'Hare for Israel from Airport. Meals and drinks served on flight.

Day 2 (Mon. Oct. 21): Arrive in Tel Aviv/Bethlehem. We are welcomed by our Representative then drive to Judean Hill Country for dinner. Overnight: Nazareth/Tiberias.

Day 3 (Tues. Oct. 22): Bethlehem: Visit the Church of the Nativity, built over the Grotto of Jesus' birth; see Manger, Grotto of St. Jerome, church of St. Catherine. Overnight Jerusalem.

Day 4 (Wed. Oct. 23): Ein Karem, village where John the Baptist was born, Church of the Visitation & Church of St. John. Overnight Jerusalem.

Day 5 (Thurs. Oct. 24): Jerusalem/Tiberias: Leave Jerusalem, drive along Mediterranean coast to Caesarea, where St. Peter preached & St. Paul was imprisoned for two years. Then to port city of Haifa. Ascend Mt. Carmel, home of Prophets Elijah & Elisha, for Mass. Then to Nazareth/Tiberias, our home for the next three nights.

Day 6 (Fri. Oct. 25): See Nazareth, home of Holy Family, Joseph's Workshop, Grotto of the Annunciation. Then to Cana where Jesus changed water to wine. Couples may renew wedding vows. Then to top of Mt. Tabor, Mass at site of Jesus' Transfiguration. Overnight in Nazareth.

Day 7 (Sat. Oct. 26): See Tabgha, site of miracle of loaves & fish. Mass on shore of the Sea of Galilee where Jesus called His disciples & appeared after His resurrection. Visit Capernaum, home of our Lord during his ministry, see synagogue where He taught. Mount of the Beatitudes (Sermon on Mount) for Mass. Scenic boat ride on Sea of Galilee. Overnight in Nazareth.

Day 8 (Sun. Oct. 27): To Jericho, oldest known city in the world; then to Qumran (Dead Sea Scrolls); to Massada & the fortress built by Herod the Great; to Ein Gedi – may swim in the salty waters of the Dead Sea. Stop at Jordan River, renew baptismal vows. Overnight in Jerusalem.

Day 9 (Mon. Oct. 28): Jerusalem: ancient Jewish Temple/Wailing Wall. On to Mt. Zion & the Upper Room, celebrating Mass near where Jesus ate Last Supper. Visit Dormition Abbey where Mary “fell asleep” before her Assumption. Drive to Bethany, home of Mary/Martha/Lazarus. Overnight Jerusalem

Day 10 (Tues. Oct. 29): Mount of Olives; Church of Paternoster where Jesus taught Lord's Prayer; Chapel of Christ's Ascension; walk the Palm Sunday road to Chapel of Dominus Flevit & Mass; Garden of Gethsemane; Tomb of Mary; Church of St. Peter in Gallicantu where Peter denied Jesus.

Day 11 (Wed. Oct. 30): Walk through the narrow cobble stone streets of the Old City of Jerusalem, Mass at the Church of St. Anne - the birthplace of Mary; see Pool of Bethesda where Jesus healed the cripple. Follow Jesus' Way of the Cross to the Church of the Holy Sepulcher to visit Mount Calvary & the Tomb of Our Savior. Overnight in Jerusalem.

Day 12 (Thurs. Oct. 31): Return flight to O'Hare Airport, Chicago.

12 Promises of the Sacred Heart



In the 1670's Our Lord Jesus Christ made these 12 promises to St. Margaret Mary to those who honor His Sacred Heart, the great Symbol of His divine & human love:

1. I will give them all the graces necessary for their state in life.
2. I will establish peace in their families.
3. I will comfort them in their trials.
4. I will be their secure refuge during life, and, above all, in death.
5. I will shed abundant blessings on all their undertakings
6. Sinners will find in My Heart an infinite ocean of mercy.
7. Lukewarm souls will become fervent.
8. Fervent souls will rapidly grow in holiness and perfection.
9. I will bless every place where an image of My Heart shall be exposed and honored.
10. I will give to priests the gift of touching the most hardened hearts.
11. The names of those who promote this devotion will be written in My Heart, never to be blotted out.
12. I promise thee, in the excessive mercy of My Heart, that My all-powerful love will grant to all those who receive Holy Communion on the First Friday of nine consecutive months, the grace of final penitence; they shall not die in My disgrace nor without receiving their Sacraments; My Divine Heart shall be their safe refuge in this last moment.
