Planned Parenthood's Profit Scheme

For Planned Parenthood, chemical abortions are not a means of "providing healthcare;" chemical abortions are a means of earning profit. Chemical abortions are relatively low-cost to healthcare providers. Unlike surgical abortions, chemical abortions are performed by providing a two-pill regimen that does not require an operating room, medical equipment, or a surgically-trained physician.

In May 2018, Planned Parenthood began to enact a plan: they opened the first ever chemical abortion -only facility in Sheboygan. Their next challenge was making distribution easier. Currently, Wisconsin laws dictate that a physician, not a nurse, distribute the pills to women seeking abortions. The patient is required to have two separate visits with the same doctor - one 24 hours prior to the pills being distributed. These laws exist to protect women, but they limit Planned Parenthood's ability to profit.

In November 2018, all five statewide elected offices were won by Democrats - friends of Planned Parenthood. They quickly saw their opportunity to get rid of these laws. In January 2019, Planned Parenthood filed a suit against the state in hopes of overturning protective laws.

As newly-elected Attorney General Josh Kaul was endorsed by and received donations from Planned Parenthood during his campaign, we asked that Kaul recuse himself from this case. He refused. The legislature quickly sought to intervene and hire outside help to adequately defend our laws, but this request was denied by the Seventh Circuit Court of Appeals. Josh Kaul is now in charge of defending our state against his friends at Planned Parenthood.

If Planned Parenthood is successful in overturning these laws, they could perform chemical abortions at all 24 of their facilities across the state. Abortion numbers in Wisconsin could more than double. Over 7,000 lives are at risk. Wisconsin Right to Life has maintained contact with the Attorney General's office and offered support in the form of providing amicus briefs and other legal resources. *We need your help to defend our laws!* By returning the enclosed envelope, you won't only help the programs of the WRTL Education Fund, you will help ensure our pro-life laws remain in place.
