

Spiritual Advice from St. Maximilian Kolbe

During wartime, in September 1940, St. Maximilian Kolbe wrote to the Franciscan friars in Japan who had sent a report about their activity. In his letter, he emphasized the importance of the spiritual life:

"Let us pray, let us pray well, pray much, both with our lips and in our thought, and we shall experience in ourselves how the Immaculata [the BVM] will take increasing possession of our souls, how our belonging to her will deepen more and more in every respect, how our sins will vanish, and our flaws will weaken, how gently and powerfully we will come ever closer to God. Outer activity is good, but, of course, is of secondary importance, and even less than that when compared to the inner life, to the life of recollection and prayer, to the life of our own personal love for God. ... To the extent in which we burn more and more with divine love, we will kindle a similar love even in others."

Let us ask the Immaculata to share with us her docility and openness to the Holy Spirit and to teach us how to cooperate perfectly with God's will, thus becoming His instruments as she has been. (From the MI International Office)

Act of Total Consecration to the Immaculata (composed by St. Maximilian Kolbe)

O Immaculata, Queen of Heaven and earth, refuge of sinners and our most loving Mother, God has willed to entrust the entire order of mercy to you. I, (name), a repentant sinner, cast myself at your feet humbly imploring you to take me with all that I am and have, wholly to yourself as your possession and property.

Please make of me, of all my powers of soul and body, of my whole life, death and eternity, whatever most pleases you. If it pleases you, use all that I am and have without reserve, wholly to accomplish what was said of you: "She will crush your head" [Gen. 3:15] and, "You alone have destroyed all heresies in the world."

Let me be a fit instrument in your immaculate and merciful hands for introducing and increasing your glory to the maximum in all the many strayed and indifferent souls, and thus help extend as far as possible the blessed Kingdom of the most Sacred Heart of Jesus.

For wherever you enter, you obtain the grace of conversion and growth in holiness, since it is through your hands that all graces come to us from the most Sacred Heart of Jesus.
