

## St. Catherine Labouré & the Miraculous Medal

**On July 18, 1830**, the Virgin Mary appeared to Sister Catherine Labouré in the chapel of the convent of the Missionaries of Charity (a religious order for women founded by St Vincent de Paul) in Paris, France. Mary solemnly promised: "*Come to the foot of this altar. There, graces will be poured out on all those who ask for them with confidence and fervor*."

The apparitions culminated on **November 27, 1830**: Sister Catherine saw the Virgin Mary holding in her hands a small golden globe, and she heard Mary say: "*This globe represents the whole world, France, and each person in particular.*"

She had **another vision** of the **Miraculous Medal**, in which the Blessed Virgin appeared standing over the globe of the earth with her foot over the head of the serpent, Satan, and with open hands, from rays were coming from her fingers. A voice explained: "*These rays are the symbol of the graces I pour out on those who ask me for them.*" Some rays, however, remained dark: those are the graces that no one asks for. On the outside border of the medal appeared the inscription: "*O Mary conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee.*" On the other side of the medal appeared the letter M with a cross atop of the M, and beneath the M, the image of both Hearts of Jesus and Mary. The Heart of Mary had a sword passing through it – from the prophecy of Simeon to Mary at the Presentation of Baby Jesus: "*Thine own soul/heart a sword shall pierce,*" a prophecy fulfilled on Calvary when Our Lady's Heart was pierced by a sword of sorrows.



But for Catherine, the most striking moment was the vision of the intercessory prayer of the "Mighty Virgin" before God. "*When she prayed, her figure was so beautiful, so beautiful, that it could not be depicted*." This vision of Mary imploring her motherly intercession from Heaven - the "Virgin with the globe", the famous "Mighty Virgin" - delighted the soul of St. Catherine!

#### Kenosha Catholic Schools Alliance

In response to Archbishop Jerome Listecki's vision for increased formal collaboration among Catholic schools, we are taking exciting new steps to strengthen Catholic education in Kenosha by encouraging stronger collaboration between All Saints Catholic School and St Joseph Catholic Academy. The **Kenosha Catholic Schools Alliance (KCSA)**, a strategic collaboration between Kenosha's archdiocesan Catholic schools, has been formed to shepherd this effort. Members of the community will be invited to serve on visioning core committees for the project.

**Goals of the Kenosha Catholic Schools Alliance.** This KCSA taskforce, representing Kenosha clergy, school board members, administrators, faculty, parents, parish representatives, and key Catholic community leaders, will be exploring opportunities to further the excellence of a city-wide Catholic school network in Kenosha.

**Independence of our Kenosha Catholic Schools.** All Saints Catholic School and St Joseph Catholic Academy each remain separate schools within the new Kenosha Catholic Schools Alliance. KCSA simply seeks to formalize the cooperation the two schools have always informally maintained and provides new opportunities to build on the schools' Catholic mission and to better serve the Catholic community in Kenosha. # HAVE YOU RECEIVED THE SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION?

Every baptized person not yet confirmed can and should receive the sacrament of Confirmation. Since Baptism, Confirmation, and the Holy Eucharist form a unity, it follows that "the faithful are obliged to receive this sacrament at the appropriate time," for "without Confirmation and the Eucharist, Baptism is certainly valid and efficacious, but Christian initiation remains incomplete" (Catechism of the Catholic Church 1306)
