SEIZING CONTROL OF THE MEANS OF INFORMATION is the *sine qua non* of a successful coup. Soros-backed liberals try to get US bishops' pro-life chair fired for criticizing pro-abortion Biden

March 23, 2021 (Lifesite News) – Liberal "Christian" groups are trying to get Archbishop Joseph Naumann, head of the U.S. Catholic bishops' pro-life committee, fired for his denunciation of Joe Biden's radical support for abortion. [Last year Democratic presidential candidate Joe Biden affirmed his support of abortion "under any circumstance," saying "Republicans in state legislatures will stop at nothing to get rid of *Roe* — and we have to be just as strong in our defense of it." He promised to "codify *Roe v. Wade*" as president, adding, "my Justice Department will do everything in its power to stop the rash of state laws that so blatantly violate a woman's protected, constitutional right to choose"; see Lifesite News, July 1, 2020.]

Faith in Public Life and Faithful America – two far-left, so-called religious groups backed by atheist mega-donor George Soros – launched an online petition last week to unseat Naumann from his committee post.

Naumann slammed Biden in an interview in February, correcting the longtime pro-abortion, pro-LGBT Democrat's claims of being a "devout Catholic." "The president should stop defining himself as a devout Catholic, and acknowledge that his view on abortion is contrary to Catholic moral teaching," the archbishop said. "When he says he is a devout Catholic, we bishops have the responsibility to correct him. Although people have given this president power and authority, he cannot define what it is to be a Catholic and what Catholic moral teaching is."

Naumann also stressed that Biden should not receive the Eucharist. "I believe the president has the responsibility not to present himself for Holy Communion," he said, adding that Biden "should not put the priest in the situation where he has to decide whether or not to allow him to receive the Eucharist. He should know that after 78 years as a Catholic."
