

June 6, 2021 The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

Friday, June 11: Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus

The Sacred Heart of Jesus is the great Symbol of His twofold love for us, Divine and human, as both God and man. Devotion to the Heart of Jesus began when Our Lord's side and Heart were pierced after His death on the Cross, and developed over the centuries. In the 1670's Our Lord revealed to St. Margaret Mary that His Heart is present (along with His Body and Blood) in the Eucharist; He also made 12 promises to those who show devotion to His Heart:

12 PROMISES of the SACRED HEART of JESUS to ST. MARGARET MARY

- (1) I will give them all the graces necessary in their state of life.
- (2) I will establish peace in their homes.
- (3) I will comfort them in all their afflictions.
- (4) I will be their secure refuge during life, and above all, in death.
- (5) I will bestow abundant blessings upon all their undertakings.
- (6) Sinners will find in my Heart the source and infinite ocean of mercy.
- (7) Lukewarm souls shall become fervent.
- (8) Fervent souls shall quickly mount to high perfection.
- (9) I will bless every place in which an image of my Heart is exposed and honored.
- 10) I will give to priests the gift of touching the most hardened hearts.
- (11) Those who shall promote this devotion shall have their names written in my Heart.
- (12) I promise you in the excessive mercy of my Heart that my all-powerful love will grant to all those who receive Holy Communion on the First Fridays in nine consecutive months the grace of final perseverance; they shall not die in my disgrace, nor without receiving their sacraments. My divine Heart shall be their safe refuge in this last moment.

Here is a beautiful "3 o'clock prayer" to the wound of Christ's Heart by Carthusian Antoine de Molina (1550-1612):

O Jesus my Saviour, how greatly am I indebted to Thee for having willed that Thy Side should be opened with a spear, that in the depth of Thy Heart we might behold Thy great love for us, and for having permitted Thy holy Body, when taken down from the Cross, to be placed in the arms of Thy Blessed Mother, who received it bathed in tears and with her heart broken and pierced with most bitter grief. I beseech Thee, O Lord, to pierce my heart with a true wound of love, to cleanse my soul from all its stains with the Water that came out of thy Side, and to heal its infirmities with the remedy of Thy Blood. Grant me the grace to share in sorrows of Thy most holy Mother at the time of Thy Passion and Thy death. Make me one of her most faithful and devoted servants, that she may vouchsafe to take me under her protection and to assist me in my trials and necessities, especially at the hour of my death. Amen.

Saturday, June 12: Feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary

The Immaculate Heart of Mary is the great symbol of her love for God, for her Son Jesus, and for all of us, her spiritual children; it is also the symbol of her virtue and spotless purity. Devotion to Mary's Heart began with the references to her Heart that we see in St. Luke's Gospel, that Mary "kept all these things, pondering them in her Heart" (Lk. 2:19; cf. 2:51); and that, as Simeon foretold, her soul/Heart would be "pierced with a sword [of sorrow]" (Lk. 2:35), which was fulfilled at Calvary. There are many beautiful prayers in honor of Mary's Immaculate Heart; here is a consecration prayer:

THE IMMACULATE HEART OF MARY

Daily Consecration to the Sorrowful & Immaculate Heart of Mary

O Virgin Mary, Mother of Divine Love, Queen of Heaven and Refuge of Sinners, I consecrate myself to your Sorrowful and Immaculate Heart.

I consecrate to you my whole life; all that I have and all that I am. I give you my body, my heart and my soul, holding nothing back. I am wholly yours, Good Mother; keep me and guard me as your property and possession.

And to make this act of consecration truly effective and lasting, I renew this day at your feet the promises of my Baptism: to reject sin and Satan. I promise to profess courageously and at all times the truths of the Holy Catholic Faith, to keep the Commandments of God and His Church, and in particular to keep holy the Lord's Day. I also promise to pray part of the Holy Rosary each day while meditating on its mysteries.

O Mother of the Savior, I will strive in all my thoughts, words and actions to imitate your exalted virtues in order to better imitate Jesus Christ and His interior life, especially His meekness and humility of Heart which you imitated so perfectly. I will strive also to offer all my sufferings, both bodily and spiritual, in union with the sorrows which pierced your Heart, in reparation for sins which offend the Eucharistic Heart of Jesus.

Finally, I promise, O glorious Mother of God and our Mother in the Order of Grace, to make better known the greatness of your sublime privileges in to order to extend, through the dominion of your Immaculate Heart, Christ's Kingdom on earth and the reign of His Sacred Heart in the hearts of all men. Amen.
