Catholic Medical Association joins lawsuit to overturn Biden Admin transgender mandate (J-P Mauro – *Aleteia* 08/26/21)

A lawsuit has been filed to challenge **a Biden administration mandate requiring doctors to perform gender transition procedures**. The lawsuit was filed jointly by the Catholic Medical Association (CMA) and the Alliance Defending Freedom (ADF), who claim the mandate disregards the medical judgments and religious beliefs of doctors.

According to a press release, the CMA and ADF are representing an OB-GYN doctor who specializes in adolescents. CMA president, Dr. Michael Parker, decried the HHS's reinterpretation of the Affordable Care Act, which prohibits gender discrimination in medical practice. Dr. Parker said: "This mandate not only puts the health and safety of our patients in jeopardy, but it in effect also mandates that healthcare providers give up their fundamental right to conscience. This sets a dangerous precedent with incalculable implications for the ethical practice of medicine." Dr. Parker went on to stress that, "Biological identity must remain the basis for treating patients."

The new interpretation of the Affordable Care Act <u>requires</u> gender transition interventions, services, procedures, and drugs <u>on demand</u>. These demands must be met, <u>even for children</u>, <u>regard-less of a doctor's conscientious objection</u>, or better medical judgement. Senior Counsel of the Alliance Defending Freedom, Ryan Bangert, supported Parker's statements. Bangert expounded upon the perils of subjecting children to gender transition. "The laws of our land and the medical profession have long respected the biological differences between boys and girls and the unique needs they each present in health care. Forcing doctors to prescribe transition hormones for 13-year-olds or perform life altering surgeries on adolescents is unlawful, unethical, and dangerous," said ADF Senior Counsel Ryan Bangert.

News about China from Dr. Steven Mosher, President, Population Research Institute (pri@pop.org)

(Dr. Steven Mosher was the first person to report Communist China's brutal forced abortion/one child policy which he learned of while working as a graduate student in China back in the 1980's. Then an atheist, he converted to the Catholic Church, largely under the influence of the great pro-life priest Fr. Paul Marx, OSB and now heads the pro-life/pro-family *Population Research Institute*)

Communist China: Doomed and Dangerous: PRI President Steven Mosher reviewed the new **three-child policy** that Xi Jinping has instituted in China. It is doubtful that raising the birth limit to three will have much effect on China's demographic issue. Mosher points out, "There are simply too few young women of childbearing age remaining to offset the coming population crash." In addition to this, women in China who are of childbearing age have responded negatively to the policy. Many Chinese work a "996" schedule, meaning 9:00am to 9:00pm six days a week, leaving little to no free time for family life, such as helping elderly parents or raising children. The question arises, what will the CCP do if the Chinese people do not comply? Mosher shared with Raymond Arroyo on his EWTN show the World Over, "I don't think we are going to be in the voluntary state very long. It [the CCP] would not hesitate to force women to have children, so we may be seeing forced pregnancy."

China's Persecution of the Catholic Church: PRI President Steven Mosher appeared on Raymond Arroyo's EWTN show the World Over and said that the Chinese Communist Party has upped their persecution of Christians, especially Catholics. Mosher notes that CCP officials confiscate Bibles, destroy crucifixes, and fine the "offending" Catholics.
