The Jesuit Martyrs of North America

Feast Day: October 19



The eight North American martyrs, also known as the Jesuit Martyrs of North America or the Canadian Martyrs, include the French Jesuit priests St. Isaac Jogues (1607-1646) and St. John de Brebeuf (1593-1649) and their companions St. John de Lalande, St. René Goupil, St. Anthony Daniel, St. Charles Garnier, St. Gabriel Lalemant, and St. Noel Chabanel. They were among the first missionaries to the North American Indians, among which were the Huron tribe, and the Iroquois confederacy which included the Mohawk tribe. These Jesuits were the first martyrs of North America. They served missions in remote areas of eastern Canada and New York State between 1625-1649.

The Jesuits were mostly accepted by the Hurons, but the Iroquois tribes hated both the Hurons and the French. The French were trade partners with the Hurons and, as such, sided with them against their long-time enemies, the Iroquois.

Five of the eight North American martyrs were put to death in what is now Canada, and three of them in New York State. There is a shrine to the United States' martyrs at Auriesville in New York; there is also a shrine to the Canadian martyrs at Fort Saint Mary near Midland, Ontario.


Saint Isaac Jogues, after thirteen months' imprisonment by the Mohawks, had several fingers cut off of his hand. He went back to his native France, but returned again to North America and was killed by tomahawk blows at Ossernenon, now called Auriesville, in New York State.

Saint John de Brebeuf was tortured terribly, and declared before he died, “I have a strong desire to suffer for Jesus Christ.” A burning torch was put into his mouth, which strangled him.

The Jesuit Martyrs of North American were canonized June 29 of 1930 by Pope Pius XI.
