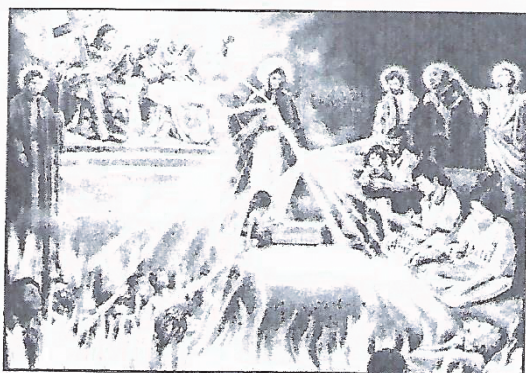
OUR PARISH MISSION

Summary of Norms for Gaining Indulgences for the Holy Souls in Purgatory or Oneself

(issued by Pope Paul VI on January 1, 1967)

A plenary indulgence is a complete release from the temporal punishment due for sins already forgiven (as far as their guilt is concerned).

Conditions for a plenary indulgence:

- A. One must be baptized and in the state of grace.
- B. One must receive Holy Communion each time a plenary indulgence is sought.
- C. One must go to Confession several days preceding or following the indulgenced action. A single sacramental Confession suffices for gaining several plenary indulgences.
- D. One must have a disposition of mind and heart which totally excludes all attachment to sin, even venial sin.
- E. One must pray for the intentions of the Pope, preferably one "Our Father" and one "Hail Mary." However, any other pious prayer may be substituted.
- F. One must have at least a general intention to gain a plenary indulgence.

G. One must perform the indulgenced work.

One plenary indulgence may be obtained every day by completing one of the following works, provided the conditions mentioned above have been fulfilled:

- At least a half hour of adoration of the Blessed Sacrament,
- or family or group Rosary,
- or private Rosary before the Blessed Sacrament,
- or at least a half hour of pious reading of Sacred Scripture,
- or walking the Stations of the Cross in a church or with a properly erected display of the Stations.

Conditions for a partial indulgence

A partial indulgence removes part of the temporal punishment due for sins already forgiven. Several partial indulgences may be obtained each day under the following conditions:

- A. One must be baptized and in the state of grace.
- B. One must be inwardly contrite.
- C. One must have a general intention to gain an indulgence.
- D. One must fulfill the action prescribed in one of the following three general grants of indulgences:
 - Raise one's mind in humble prayer to God while fulfilling one's responsibilities and enduring the trials of life;
 - or give oneself or one's goods as a charitable act to assist people who are in need of spiritual comfort or instruction or those who are in need of material assistance (donation of time and resources to the Church are, therefore, indulgenced);
 - or voluntarily deprive oneself of what is lawful and pleasing, such as fasting or giving up dessert or a favorite TV program, while maintaining a positive attitude.

List of Prayers & Good Works to obtain Partial Indulgences


(from the Enchiridion of Indulgences)

The following prayers/good works carry the grant of a partial indulgence by the Church, which means that by performing them we obtain a partial remission of punishment due for sins already forgiven either in this life or in Purgatory. The partial indulgence from the following prayers and good works can be applied to oneself or to a soul in Purgatory. To obtain the partial indulgence, one must be in a state of grace and have the intention to obtain it. There is no limit to the number of partial indulgences one may obtain per day:

- 1 Visit the Blessed Sacrament to adore
- 2 Angel of God prayer
- 3 Angelus prayer
- 4 Teach or learn Christian Doctrine
- 5 Soul of Christ (Anima Christi) prayer: *Soul of Christ, sanctify me. Body of Christ, save me. Blood of Christ, inebriate me. Water from Christ's side, wash me. Passion of Christ, strengthen me. Good Jesus, hear me. Within your wounds, hide me. Never let me be parted from You. From the evil enemy, protect me. At the hour of my death, call me and tell me to come to You that with Your Saints I may praise You for all eternity. Amen.*
- 6 Memorare prayer: *Remember, O Most Gracious Virgin Mary, that never was it known that anyone who fled to Thy protection, implored Thy help or sought Thy intercession was left unprotected. Inspired by this confidence, I fly unto Thee, O Virgin of virgins, my Mother. To Thee do I come, before Thee I stand, sinful and sorrowful. O Mother of the Word Incarnate, despise not petitions, but in Thy mercy, hear and answer me. Amen.*
- 7 Hail, Holy Queen (Salve, Regina) prayer
- 8 Use an article of devotion (Crucifix or Cross, Rosary, Scapular or Medal) properly blessed by a priest
- 9 Spend time in mental prayer
- 10 Listen attentively to the sacred preaching of the Word of God (e.g., at Mass)
- 11 Sing or recite the hymns of Eucharistic adoration, Humbly I Adore Thee (Adoro Te Devote) or Down in Adoration Falling (Tantum Ergo)
- 12 We Fly to Thy Patronage (Sub Tuum Praesidium) prayer: *We fly to Thy patronage, O Holy Mother of God; despise not our prayers in our necessities, but ever deliver us from all dangers. O Glorious and Blessed Virgin Mary. Amen.*
- 13 Come, Holy Spirit (Veni, Sancte Spiritus) prayer: *Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of Thy faithful and kindle in them the fire of Thy love.*
- 14 Look Down on Me, Good and Gentle Jesus prayer (see back of missalette)
- 15 Magnificat prayer (Mary's prayer at the Visitation) (see Luke 1:46-55)
- 16 Act of Spiritual Communion: *My Jesus, I believe that Thou art Really Present in the Most Blessed Sacrament of the Altar. I love Thee above all things and desire to possess Thee within my soul. Since I cannot receive Thee sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace Thee as being already there and unite myself entirely to Thee. Never let me be separated from Thee. Amen.*
- 17 Litanies: the Most Holy Name of Jesus, the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, the Most Precious Blood of Our Lord, the Blessed Virgin Mary, St. Joseph, All Saints.
