

Scripture Tells the Holy Spirit's Story

"The prophetic texts about the sending of the Holy Spirit are sayings in which God speaks to the heart," Catechism, 715.

In the ancient Jewish liturgy, Pentecost was the feast of Mount Sinai. It celebrated the giving of the Ten Commandments to Moses and the sealing of God's covenant with His people. A mighty wind and fire swept the slopes of Sinai, evoking awe. The wind was the breath/Spirit of God as the source of life. The fire was God's glory, manifesting His presence to His people. The Upper Room of the Christian Pentecost is the new Sinai. Once again the mighty breath/Spirit of God and His fiery presence sweeps through the human community. Pentecost is a new Sinai in which the Holy Spirit is set as a seal on the universe, a declaration of God's irrevocable love for all people. Scripture reveals the work of the Holy Spirit in the entire work of creation and redemption.

The Holy Spirit in the Old Testament

The work of the Holy Spirit is present, though hidden in signs and images, in all the key moments of the Old Testament. We see the Holy Spirit's action in the call of Abraham and as the cloud and fire associated with the call of Moses and giving of the Law. He anoints judges and kings and speaks through the prophets. After the exile, the Holy Spirit prompts the expectation of the Messiah. His gifts will dwell in the Messiah. The Holy Spirit will enable Him to be the historic fulfillment of the redemptive Suffering Servant (cf. Is 53).

The Holy Spirit in the New Testament

In the New Testament, the Holy Spirit's work becomes visible, overshadowing Mary at the Annunciation, giving force and energy to the ministry of John the Baptist, and powerfully linked to the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. The Holy Spirit creates a community of all the devout poor who come to Christ: the shepherds, Simeon and Anna, the Cana couple, and the first disciples. When His hour had come to be glorified, Jesus promised the gift of the Holy Spirit and explained that the Holy Spirit will dwell in us, make clear the full meaning of His teaching, and lead us into all truth. As for our sinfulness, the Holy Spirit will convict us of our evil and convert our hearts to Christ and the gift of grace. On Easter night, Jesus breathed on His Apostles the gift of the Holy Spirit (Jn 20:20). This is sometimes called the "Johannine Pentecost." It anticipates the full public gift of the Holy Spirit that is described in St. Luke's account of Pentecost (Acts 2). Christians should be souls on fire. We will be warm as long as we stay near the Spirit of divine fire.
