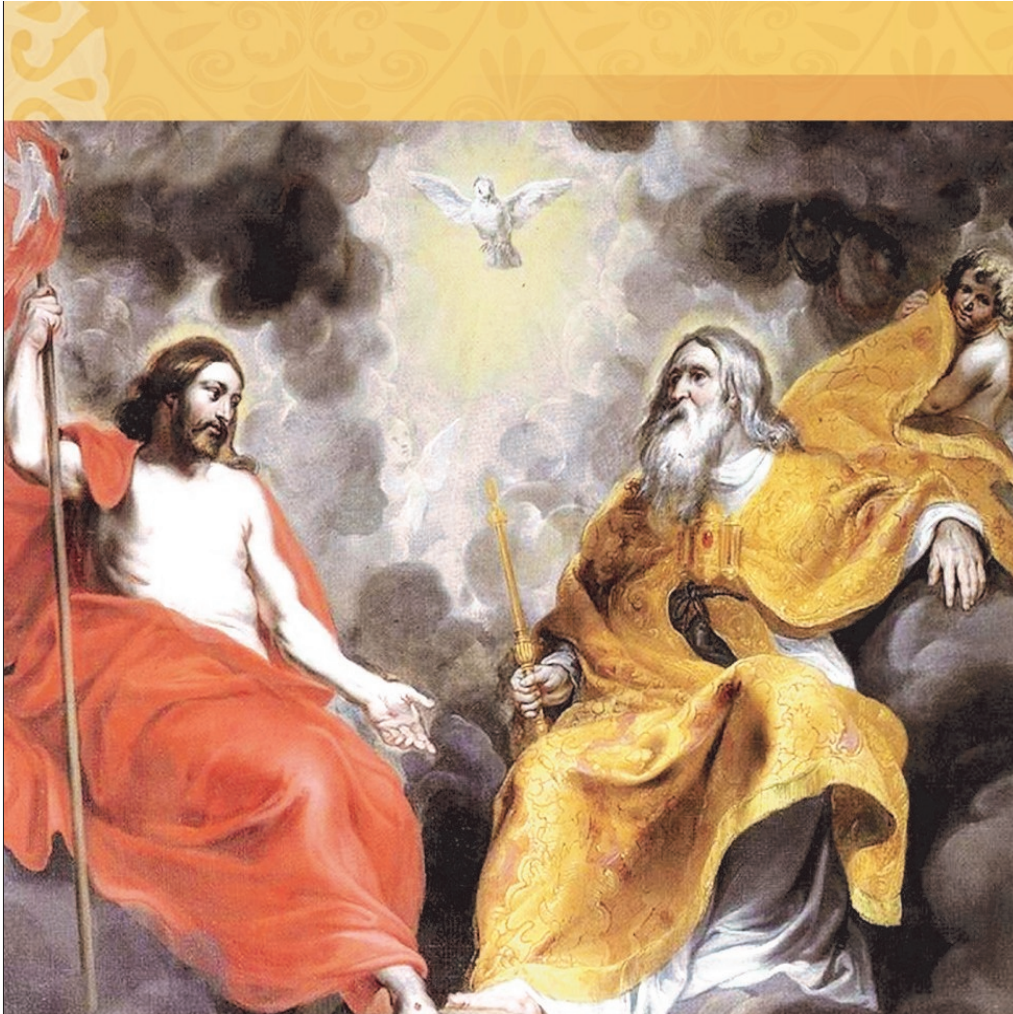

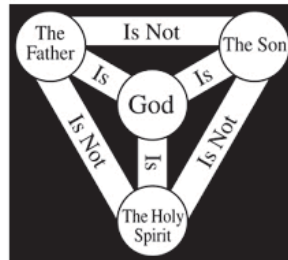
Miraculous Prayer to the Little Flower

June 12, 2022 The Most Holy Trinity

TRINITY SUNDAY

The dogma of faith which forms the object of the feast is this: There is one God and in this one God there are three Divine Persons; the Father is God, the Son is God, the Holy Spirit is God. Yet there are not three Gods, but one, eternal, incomprehensible God! The Father is not more God than the Son, neither is the Son more God than the Holy Spirit. The Father is the first Divine Person; the Son is the second Divine Person, begotten from the nature of the Father from eternity; the Holy Spirit is the third Divine Person, proceeding from the Father and the Son. No mortal can fully fathom this sublime truth. But I submit humbly and say: *Lord, I believe, help my weak faith.*



The Doctrine of the Trinity

Why is this feast celebrated at this particular time? It may be interpreted as a finale to all the preceding feasts. All three Persons contributed to and shared in the work of redemption. The Father sent His Son to earth, for "God so loved the world as to give His only-begotten Son." The Father called us to the faith. The Son, our Savior Jesus Christ, became man and died for us. He redeemed us and made us children of God. He ever remains the liturgist *par excellence* to whom we are united in all sacred functions. After Christ's ascension the Holy Spirit, however, became our Teacher, our Leader, our Guide, our Consoler. On solemn occasions a thanksgiving *Te Deum* rises spontaneously from Christian hearts.

The feast of the Most Holy Trinity may well be regarded as the Church's *Te Deum* of gratitude over all the blessings of the Christmas and Easter seasons; for this mystery is a synthesis of Christmas, Epiphany, Easter, Ascension and Pentecost. This feast, which falls on the first Sunday after Pentecost, should make us mindful that actually every Sunday is devoted to the honor of the Most Holy Trinity, that every Sunday is sanctified and consecrated to the triune God. Sunday after Sunday we should recall in a spirit of gratitude the gifts which the Blessed Trinity is bestowing upon us. The Father created and predestined us; on the first day of the week He began the work of creation. The Son redeemed us; Sunday is the "Day of the Lord," the day of His resurrection. The Holy Spirit sanctified us, made us His temple; on Sunday the Holy Spirit descended upon the infant Church. Sunday, therefore, is *the* day of the Most Holy Trinity. Andrei Rublev's icon of the Trinity (15th c.) is regarded as one of the great works of Christian art. Rublev was Russian Orthodox.

The three Divine Persons are depicted as angels (who visited Abraham; cf. Gen. 18:1-16). God the Father is seated at the left; both the Son and the Holy Spirit look lovingly at Him. God the Son sits in the middle, with two fingers extended on His right hand. God the Holy Spirit sits at the right. All three Divine Persons sit around an altar in the shape of a chalice, with the Eucharist resting in the middle.

President Joe Biden says Overturning *Roe v. Wade* Would Result in "Brutality" to Women

During a fundraising speech to top Democratic donors on May 11, Joe Biden slammed the "brutality" of the Supreme Court's draft ruling overturning *Roe v. Wade* but ignored the brutality of how babies are dismembered.
