

#### June: Month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus

The month of June is the month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. When Jesus appeared to **St. Margaret Mary Alacoque** in the 1670's and revealed to her the mysteries of His Heart, He said He wanted a feast dedicated to His Sacred Heart on the Friday within the octave of the Feast of *Corpus Christi*. That is why we celebrate the Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus this coming Friday, which follows *Corpus Christi* (today's feast).

We adore the Sacred Heart of Jesus because it is the Heart of Our Lord, the Word made flesh, and it is the most excellent symbol of His two-fold love: divine and human. Christ's Heart was pierced the soldiers lance after He died on the cross in order to show us how much He loved us.


In what is called the "Great Revelation" of Jesus to St. Margaret Mary in June of 1675, Jesus revealed that He wants us to worship and adore *His Heart present in the Eucharist*. His Heart is present because the *entire Jesus* is present in the Eucharist: His divinity (because He is truly God, the Second Person of the Holy Trinity), and His complete humanity – His human body, blood and soul (because He is truly man); and because His complete humanity is present in the Eucharist, His Heart is present as well – His *Eucharistic Heart*, as we call it. Here are Jesus' words to St. Margaret Mary:

**Behold this Heart**, Which has loved men so much, that It has spared nothing, even to exhausting and consuming Itself, in order to testify to them Its love; and in return I receive from the greater number nothing but ingratitude by reason of their irreverence and sacrileges, and by the coldness and neglect which they show Me in this Sacrament of Love.


What does Jesus reveal to us in these words He spoke to St. Margaret Mary? Precisely this: *When we worship Jesus in the Eucharist, we adore His Sacred Heart as well; when we gaze upon the consecrated Host, we gaze upon the Heart of Jesus* – the most perfect symbol of His divine and human love for us; we gaze upon all the love of the God-man, Jesus Christ!

#### The Heart of Jesus in the Eucharist

Many Eucharistic miracles in the Church over the centuries confirm this truth. For example, at Lanciano, Italy in the 9<sup>th</sup> century, the Host visibly turned to flesh and the wine visibly turned to blood at the words of consecration; and when the Host was examined in the 1970's it was found to be the flesh from the heart (living flesh, as if cut out of a man who is alive), and the blood when examined had all the properties of freshly shed blood – 1200 years after the miracle! #### PRAYER of CONSECRATION to the SACRED HEART of JESUS

Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, I consecrate myself to Your Most Sacred Heart. Take possession of my whole being; transform me into Yourself.
