San Francisco Archbishop Salvatore Cordileone Bans U.S. House Speaker Nancy Pelosi from Holy Communion for Her Support of Abortion

On May 20, San Francisco Archbishop Salvatore Cordileone (his last name means "Lion Heart"!), issued a formal public statement banning U.S. House Speaker Nancy Pelosi from receiving Holy Communion. Here is the essence of his statement:

"Unfortunately, Speaker Pelosi's position on abortion has become only more extreme over the years, especially in the last few months. Just earlier this month she once again, as she has many times before, explicitly cited her Catholic faith while justifying abortion as a "choice," this time setting herself in direct opposition to Pope Francis....

"After numerous attempts to speak with her to help her understand the grave evil she is perpetrating, the scandal she is causing, and the danger to her own soul she is risking, I have determined that the point has come in which I must make a public declaration that she is not to be admitted to Holy Communion unless and until she publicly repudiate her support for abortion "rights" and confess and receive absolution for her cooperation in this evil in the sacrament of Penance. I have accordingly sent her a Notification to this effect, which I have now made public.

"Please know that I find no pleasure whatsoever in fulfilling my pastoral duty here. Speaker Pelosi remains our sister in Christ. Her advocacy for the care of the poor and vulnerable elicits my admiration. I assure you that my action here is purely pastoral, not political. I have been very clear in my words and actions about this. Speaker Pelosi has been uppermost in my prayer intentions ever since I became the Archbishop of San Francisco. It was my prayer life that motivated me to ask people all around the country to join me in praying and fasting for her in the "Rose and Rosary for Nancy Campaign." I especially pray that she will see in the roses she has received a sign of the honest love and care that many thousands of people have for her."

Bishop Thomas Paprocki of Springfield, IL Responds:

"I fully support and earnestly commend Archbishop Cordileone's action in regard to Speaker Pelosi. *All politicians who promote abortion should not receive Holy Communion until they have repented, repaired scandal, and been reconciled to Christ and the Church.*"

Pope St. John Paul II: Abortion Promotes a Culture of Death:

"Whoever attempts to destroy human life in the womb of the mother, not only violates the sacredness of a living, growing, and developing human being, and thus opposes God, but also attacks society by undermining respect for all human life." And in his encyclical Evangelium Vitae (The Gospel of Life), no. 58, St. John Paul teaches: "The acceptance of abortion in the popular mind, in behavior and even in law itself, is a telling sign of an extremely dangerous crisis of the moral sense, which is becoming more and more incapable of distinguishing between good and evil, even when the fundamental right to life is at stake."
