

MORE on the CULTURE WAR - from ARCHBISHOP LISTECKI

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I have long held that we have been involved in a culture war for decades. There is a necessity on the part of the secular society to demean the influence of the Church and the Church's teachings. This is attempted by secular teachings that characterizes the Church's teachings as "out of date." These ideologies rely upon science when it fits the narrative, but often it is merely a dependency on the emotional presentation of the issues.

The worship that the Church engages in every Sunday is tolerated, but the voice of the Church is often minimized and excluded from the social conversation. For modern secularists, we should feel free to worship for an hour on a Sunday, but then remain silent in expressing our beliefs to the larger society. The beauty of the Church's teachings is that they are based on reason and revelation – there is a truth which will win out, but not without a struggle.

The modern culture wars have taken its toll not only on the value of human life from conception to natural death, but attacks on traditional marriage (marriage between a man and woman); the family and the primary role of parents in relationship to the raising of their children; and in a subtle way, the impact on religious liberty – the very first freedom. We can trace various moments that demand a surrender or accommodation of the Church's teachings, insistent that the Church's teachings are no longer relevant to a modern society.

The consistent teachings of the Church always embody a prophetic aspect to its presentation. I am old enough to remember the controversy surrounding the teaching on "birth control." There were angers and defiance over what some held to be an invasion of the Church in the sexual privacy of couples. St. Paul VI bravely proclaimed that one should never separate sexual relations from procreation. Prophetically, he offered that to do so would wreak havoc on the dignity of women, a weakening of the family, an increase in abortions and the potential for governments to use this as a means to regulate populations.

Sexualization of our society has only led to a glorification of the individual without consideration of the consequences to children, family, or personal dignity. This encyclical, *Humanae Vitae* (On the Transmission of Human Life) was issued July 25, 1968. In the United States, the *Roe v. Wade* decision was issued just five years later. For 26 years, we have been blessed with the teachings of St. John Paul II, whose works have commented on every aspect of social teachings of the Church, including *Humanae Vitae*, and expanded in his apostolic exhortation, *Familiaris Consortio* (Role of the Christian Family in the Modern World) on November 22, 1981.

In retrospect, St. John Paul II wrote two encyclicals that he used to form the basis for the Church's moral understanding and teachings: *Veritatis Splendor* (Splendor of the Truth) August 6, 1993, and *Evangelium Vitae* (The Gospel of the Life) March 25, 1995. Their importance forms a blueprint for consideration of any moral issues. He rejects modern moral methodologies that fail to consider absolutes and the effects of integrating the teachings into one's personal life.

In the culture wars that we are currently involved, we need the consistent and strong message of teachings that address the issues without ignoring the truth. It is in truth that we offer the best of how God has fashioned us as His creation.

Many can be discouraged by the onslaught of cultural attacks on our Catholic teachings, but this is not the first time the Church and its faithful have had to profess the teachings in the face of opposition. It is our mission to proclaim, with confidence, that the Lord Jesus and His Church is the only one who offers "Life Eternal." Be joyful that we will proclaim the truth, but with love. It will always be the heart joined to the head that gives its teachings its strongest testimony. It was in Antioch that the followers of Jesus were first called Christians – see how they LOVE ONE ANOTHER.

European Union takes Hungary to court for banning LGBT material in schools Brussels (LifeSiteNews, July **20**, **2022**) – The European Commission, the executive branch of the European Union (EU), is taking Hungary to the EU's highest court over its pro-family law banning the promotion of homosexual and "transgender" materials to minors in schools. The European Commission decided to refer Hungary to the Court of Justice of the EU over the government's refusal to revoke its Children Protection Act, which outlaws the promotion of hyper-sexualized content, including pro-LGBT materials, in schools in an effort to clamp down on pedophilia. The bill prohibits showing pornographic material or content portraying homosexuality or transgenderism to minors under the age of 18. Other measures include a registry of sex offenders, regulations on sexual education, and stronger policies against child pornography. EU bureaucrats accused the nation's conservative Fidesz government, led by the popular Prime Minister Viktor Orbán, of discrimination against LGBT-identifying citizens with the new law and violating the principles upon which the EU allegedly stands.
