## U.S. Bishops Pro-Life Chairman Responds to President Biden's Executive Order to Facilitate Killing of Unborn Children through Abortion

On Wednesday, Aug. 3, President Biden signed an executive order facilitating abortion, the second such action from President Biden in response to the United States Supreme Court's decision in *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization*, which overturned *Roe v. Wade* and *Planned Parenthood v. Casey*. Archbishop William E. Lori of Baltimore, chairman of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' Committee on Pro-Life Activities, issued the following statement in response:

"Even preceding the *Dobbs* decision, my brother bishops and I have implored the nation to stand with moms in need, and work together to protect and support women and children.

"Continued promotion of abortion takes lives and irreparably harms vulnerable pregnant mothers, their families, and society. It is the wrong direction to take at a moment when we should be working to support women and to build up a culture of life.

"I continue to call on the President and all our elected officials to increase support and care to mothers and babies, rather than facilitate the destruction of defenseless, voiceless human beings. Blessed Virgin Mary, patroness of our nation, intercede for us as we advocate to protect human life and work toward solutions that will help every mother and child flourish."

\*N.B.: As noted above, this was Biden's second executive order regarding abortion. The first one was July 7 to safeguard access to medication abortion and to strengthen "legal options available to those seeking and providing abortion services."



## More on Why Pro-Abortion Catholics Should Be Barred from Holy Communion

Monica Migliorino, Ph.D., professor, author and Director of Citizens for a Pro-Life Society, comments on Pres. Joe Biden's response to a reporter who asked him about the possibility of being denied Communion: "That's a private matter." Dr. Migliorino:

"On the contrary, the reception of Communion is a *very public matter*. Reception of Our Lord's Body and Blood is not simply between the communicant and Jesus. The celebration of the Eucharist is the most sublime social event involving the entire ecclesial body, to which the communicant has duties and responsibilities of a spiritual and moral nature.

"A scandal is committed every time those who facilitate the killing of the innocent receive Communion, an offense against the social dimension of the liturgy. Frankly, that Catholics who facilitate the killing of the unborn should be permitted to receive Our Lord's Body and Blood is madness. What, then, is the true fault of pro-abortion Catholic politicians? Driven by their obsession with a 'woman's right to choose,' to appear liberal and progressive, they fail to acknowledge the existence of the unborn. They simply cannot admit that abortion is violence. They cannot, and will not, admit that abortion *kills someone*." (*New Oxford Review*, Oct. 2021)

Dr. Migliorino is spot on when she insists: "[W]hen Catholic politicians say they personally oppose abortion, because *they believe* abortion kills innocent life, and yet facilitate such killing, they are no better than Pontius Pilate who, knowing Christ was innocent, sent Him to His death anyway. No amount of 'handwashing' cleared Pilate! This complete lack of moral integrity alone should bar pro-abortion Catholic politicians from receiving the Eucharist." (*New Oxford Review*, Dec. 2021)
