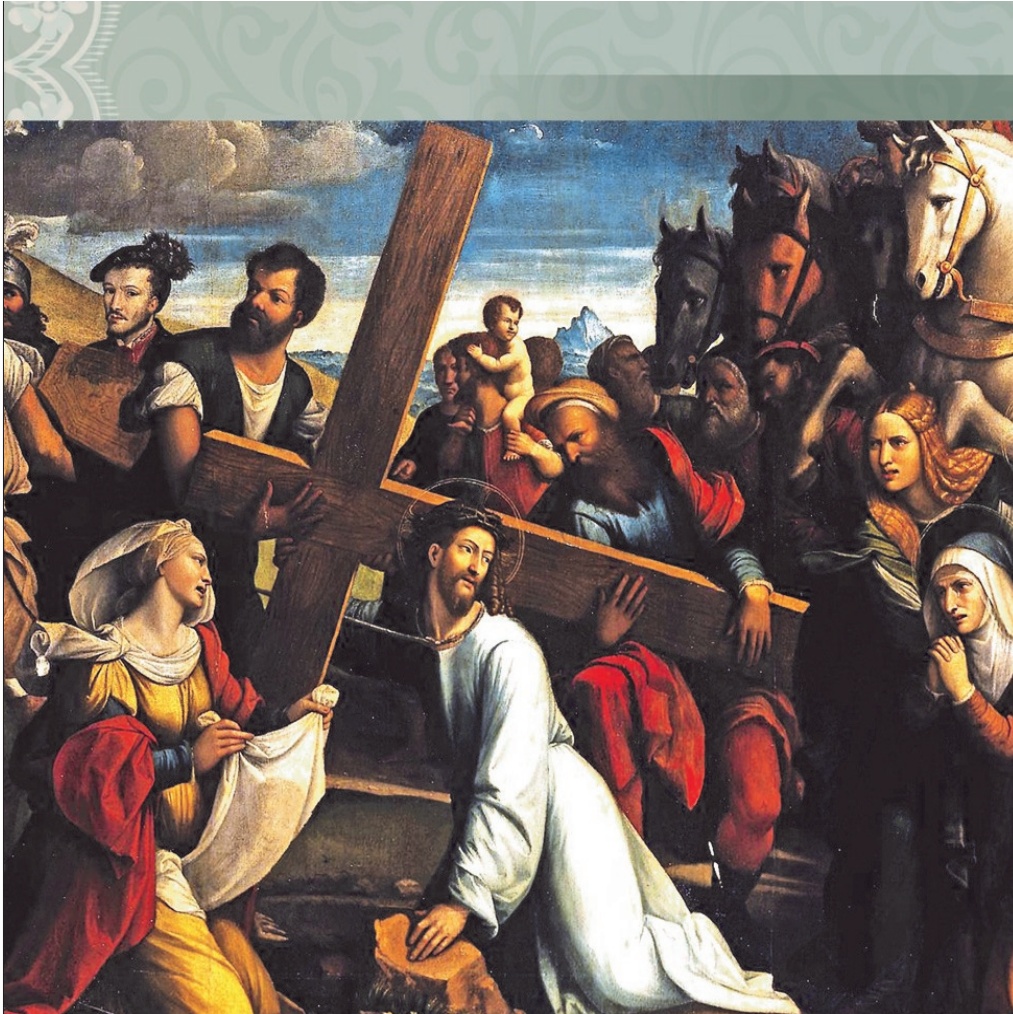

Where Charity & Law Prevail: Do Catholics Have “Rights” in the Church?

Priests accused of wrongful conduct. Concerns of lay faithful ignored. Political leaders thumb their nose at the Church’s teachings. Difficult and painful situations, no doubt.

Since the earliest days of Christianity, conflicts and controversies have been a part of the Church’s life. Over time, a body of law known as “canon law” developed to help resolve some of these problems and scandals. What, if any, role can the law of the Church play in today’s crises?

On **Wed. Sept. 7, 6:30pm at St. Therese Church** all are invited attend a talk by **Dr. Michael Mazza, J.D., J.C.D.**, a civil and canon lawyer, will address these and similar topics. Don’t miss this rare opportunity, and be sure to come with your questions!

Michael J. Mazza graduated from the Marquette University Law School in Milwaukee in 1999 and the Pontifical University of the Holy Cross in Rome in 2021. His doctoral dissertation, which he successfully defended this past May in Rome, dealt with a priest’s right to his good reputation. In addition to advocating on behalf of individuals and groups across the country - especially accused priests – Dr. Mazza serves as an Adjunct Professor of Law at Marquette (where he is presently teaching a course on canon law).
