

October is the Month of the Holy Rosary: St. Louis de Montfort's Advice on Why We Should Pray It!

St. Louis Marie Grignion de Montfort, one of the most important promoters of Marian devotion, the Rosary, and consecration to Our Lady as a sure means of growing in grace and in love for Jesus her Son and our Lord. Here is sage advice on why all of us should pray the Rosary daily:

- "It would hardly be possible for me to put into words how much Our Lady thinks of the Holy Rosary and of how she vastly prefers it to all other devotions. Neither can I sufficiently express how highly she rewards those who work to preach the devotion, to establish it and spread it, nor on the other hand how firmly she punishes those who work against it."
- "If priests and religious have an obligation to meditate on the great truths of our holy religion in order to live up to their vocation worthily, the same obligation, then, is just as much incumbent upon the laity because of the fact that every day they meet with spiritual dangers which might make them lose their souls. Therefore they should arm themselves with the frequent meditation on the life, virtues and sufferings of Our Blessed Lord which are so beautifully contained in the 15 mysteries of the Holy Rosary."
- "The Rosary is the most powerful weapon to touch the Heart of Jesus, Our Redeemer, who loves His Mother."
- "If you say the Rosary faithfully until death, I do assure you that, in spite of the gravity of your sins you shall receive a never-fading crown of glory. Even if you are on the brink of damnation, even if you have one foot in hell, even if you have sold your soul to the devil as sorcerers do who practice black magic, and even if you are a heretic as obstinate as a devil, sooner or later you will be converted and will amend your life and will save your soul, if and mark well what I say if you say the Holy Rosary devoutly every day until death for the purpose of knowing the truth and obtaining contrition and pardon for your sins."
- "Never will anyone who says his Rosary every day be led astray. This is a statement that I would gladly sign with my blood."
- "When the Holy Rosary is said well, it gives Jesus and Mary more glory and is more meritorious than any other prayer."

Gov. Evers Calls Special Session in Another Attempt to Repeal Wisconsin's Abortion Ban:

Today (Sept. 21, 2022), Governor Evers announced that he is calling for a special session of the Wisconsin Legislature to create a pathway to repeal of Wisconsin's abortion ban. The special session will take place on Wednesday, October 5, 2022. The abortion ban, which includes exceptions for medical emergencies and life of the mother, has already faced a direct challenge by Governor Evers and Attorney General Josh Kaul.

Following the overturning of *Roe V. Wade*, Wisconsin's pregnancy help centers (PHCs) have stepped in to provide services and support to women throughout their pregnancies and beyond. Governor Evers has not responded to call by Speaker Vos to provide emergency support to these PHCs.

Gracie Skogman, Wisconsin Right to Life's legislative/PAC director responded, "Governor Evers and Attorney General Kaul have been derelict in their duties as our elected officials by engaging in this political theater and refusing to ensure enforcement of Wisconsin law. Earlier this summer, we saw Governor Evers call another special session to try and pass a bill to repeal the current law. He will stop at nothing to ensure that extreme proabortionists have full permission to kill our preborn babies."

Skogman continued, "Post *Roe*, countless women are choosing life for their preborn children and are in need of compassionate care and support. Pregnancy help centers in Wisconsin are providing for these critical needs and seeing massive increases in clients, yet Governor Evers has been unwilling to support them. True empowerment of women means supporting both mothers and their preborn children."


