Guide to the Catechism of the Catholic Church

The Last Judgment

Article #35

“The resurrection of the dead, of the just and sinners, will precede the Last Judgment. The Last Judgment will introduce the glorious return of Christ,” Catechism, 1038, 1040.

Michelangelo’s mighty fresco of the Last Judgment covers the wall behind the altar in the Sistine Chapel. A legend claims that a cardinal disliked the artist’s use of nudity and harassed him about it. Irritated, Michelangelo put him in the fresco, writhing in hell. Outraged, the cardinal said to the Pope, “Make him take me out of there.” Amused, the Pope replied, “Eminence, you know very well I can only help people get out of purgatory. “Scripture states clearly that God will judge our behavior. Jesus said, “The Son of Man will come with his angels in his Father’s glory, and then he will repay everyone according to his conduct” (Mt. 16:27). In the parable of the Last Judgment, the supreme judge divides the “sheep” from the “goats” according to their deeds of love. “As long as you did it to one of these, the least of my brethren, you did it to me” (Mt 25-40). The New Testament vividly describes Christ’s second coming (Mt 24; Mk 13; and all of the book of Revelation). We should view the Second Coming of Jesus and the Last Judgment as signs of hope that God will finally establish the rule of love, justice, mercy, and salvation, which overcomes all evil and death. Those who have already experienced the Particular Judgment will not have a “second trial” at the General Judgment. They will however, be reunited to their resurrected and transfigured bodies, which will share in their eternal destinies.

A New Heaven and a New Earth

At the Second Coming, the world as we know it, distorted by sin and evil, will cease to be. Scripture speaks of a “new heaven and a new earth” (cf. 2 Pt 3:10-13; Rv 21:1) that will be created. Vatican II teaches, “We know nothing of when the earth and the human race will come to an end, nor of how the universe will be transformed. The form of this world, distorted by sin, is passing away, but we are taught that God is preparing a new dwelling place, a new earth in which justice abides, whose blessedness will satisfy and quench all man’s thirst for peace” (Modern World, 39). George Frideric Handel concludes his stirring oratorio, “The Messiah,” with the “Amen Chorus.” Similarly, the Catechism finishes its explanation of the Creed with an “Amen!” In Hebrew, “Amen” comes from the same root as the word “to believe.” The term connotes solidity, reliability, and fidelity. “Amen” speaks both of God’s faithfulness to us and of our confidence in Him. We started with, “I believe.” We end with “Amen!”

Reflection

1. *What will happen at the Last Judgment?*

At the end of time, the Kingdom of God will arrive in its fullness. The just will reign with Christ forever, glorified in body and soul, and the material universe will be transformed. God will be “all in all” (1 Cor 15:28) in eternal life (Catechism, 1060).

2. *What should we be doing before the Second Coming?*

“The expectancy of a new earth should spur us on. . . . But we should distinguish earthly progress from advancing the Kingdom of Christ. Progress is of vital concern to the Kingdom of God insofar as it can contribute better to the ordering of human society” (Modern World, 39; Catechism, 1049).

3. *Why is “Amen!” a fitting ending for the Creed?*

“Amen” in Hebrew comes from the same root as the word “to believe.” The final “Amen!” of the Creed reprises and confirms the first two words, “I believe” (Catechism, 1062, 1064).

Prayer

Thank you, Lord, for the gift of faith. Help then my unbelief and make my faith abound that I may seek where you are found.
