**“THE FAMILY THAT PRAYS TOGETHER STAYS TOGETHER”
PAPAL TEACHING on the FAMILY ROSARY**

In his encyclical on the Rosary, **Pope Pius XI** teaches: “Fathers and mothers of families particularly must give example to their children, especially when, at sunset, they gather together after the day’s work, within the domestic walls, and recite the Holy Rosary on bended knees before the image of the Virgin, together fusing voice, faith and sentiment. This is a beautiful and salutary custom, from which certainly there cannot but be derived tranquility and abundance of heavenly gifts for the household” (no. 28).

Ven. Pope Pius XII in an encyclical on the Rosary teaches that if we pray the Rosary, our homes will become “an earthly abode of sanctity” and “a sacred temple”; they will become “efficacious schools of Christian virtue”; adults will learn to better imitate Jesus and Mary and children will learn to love Our Lord “spontaneously from the heart.”

Pope St. Paul VI, in his 1974 Apostolic Exhortation *Marialis Cultus*, instructs that “the litany-like succession of Hail Marys . . . constitutes the warp on which is woven the contemplation of the mysteries” (no. 46). He goes on to say: “By its nature the recitation of the Rosary calls for a quiet rhythm and a lingering pace, helping the individual to meditate on the mysteries of the Lord’s life as seen through the eyes of her who was closest to the Lord” (no. 47).

Pope St. John Paul II in his encyclical on the Rosary complements the words of Pius XII:

“The Holy Rosary, by age-old tradition, has shown itself particularly effective as a prayer which brings the family together. Individual family members, in turning their eyes towards Jesus, also regain the ability to look one another in the eye, to communicate, to show solidarity, to forgive one another and to see their covenant of love renewed in the Spirit of God.

“Many of the problems facing contemporary families, especially in economically developed societies, result from their increasing difficulty in communicating. Families seldom manage to come together, and the rare occasions when they do are often taken up with watching television. To return to the recitation of the family Rosary means filling daily life with very different images, images of the mystery of salvation: the image of the Redeemer, the image of his most Blessed Mother. The family that recites the Rosary together reproduces something of the atmosphere of the household of Nazareth: its members place Jesus at the center, . . .” (no. 41).

“It is also beautiful and fruitful to entrust to this prayer *the growth and development of children*. . . . At times parents suffer acute disappointment at the failure of their children to resist the seductions of the drug culture, the lure of an unbridled hedonism, the temptation to violence, and the manifold expressions of meaninglessness and despair.

“To pray the Rosary *for children*, and even more *with children*, training them from their earliest years to experience this daily “pause for prayer” with the family, is admittedly not the solution to every problem, but is it a spiritual aid which should not be underestimated. . . . (no. 42).
