

Children in our society are suffering deeply from widespread fatherlessness

Arthur Goldberg (MercatorNet, reprinted in LifeSiteNews, Jan. 13, 2023) — Although I strongly believe involved fathers fulfill an irreplaceable social role both within families and in a civilized society, I was nevertheless shocked to learn a confirming fact for my views from Jack Brewer's appearance on the December 17 show "Unfiltered with Dan Bongino." Brewer, an African-American former professional football player, said, "82 percent of those who commit mass shootings don't have fathers in their lives."

In a report he previously released on behalf of the Center for Opportunity Now, an organization that seeks to revitalize the prosperity of our urban centers through private enterprise and for which Brewer serves as Chairman, he goes on to cite equally distressing figures concerning the negative effects caused by the lack of involved two-parent families: 70 percent of youths in state-operated institutions come from fatherless homes and 85 percent of youths in prison come from homes without fathers.

A plethora of other data and research Brewer highlights in his report sets forth additional negative effects for the nearly 9 million American children with absent fathers. Brewer concludes, "children from fatherless homes fare far worse in metrics of overall well-being and mental and behavioral health."

Devastating cost Consider the following additional illustrative examples he cites: 90 percent of all homeless and runaway children, 63 percent of teen suicides, and 85 percent of children and teens with behavioral disorders come from fatherless homes.

Citing figures from the US Census Bureau and other government reports, Brewer further points out how households without fathers are 25 percent more likely to raise children in poverty and how children in such households are likely to drop out of high school twice as much as children with both parents at home. Moreover, three out of four children living in public housing communities do not have a father living in the home. Other data cited by Brewer informs us that 71 percent of all children who abuse substances come from fatherless homes.

Such a negative impact upon American society is caused in part by the fact that the USA has the highest rate of children living in single-parent households of any nation in the world: 23 percent of children live with one parent and with no other adults. This figure greatly exceeds the world average, where only 7 percent of children worldwide are raised by a single parent.

The figures for populous countries such as China and India with single-parent households reflect only 3 percent and 4 percent respectively. Based upon all of the above, is it any surprise that American society is being torn asunder, fueled in part by government welfare programs that encourage and compensate single mothers? Our politically correct culture's emphasis on valuing individual gratification more than physical and emotional well-being has produced a deteriorating societal cultural climate. Even with a father present in the home, the average American school age boy only spends about 30 minutes per week in one-on-one conversations with his father as opposed to spending (on average) about 44 hours per week watching television, playing video games, and surfing the internet.

Torn asunder More than 50 years ago, Daniel Patrick Moynihan convincingly wrote about the importance of the traditional two-parent family structure and how the predominate absence of two-parent families in the African -American community was the primary predictor of negative social outcomes. Although attacked by liberals and progressives as an example of white patronizing, cultural bias, or racism, conservative black leaders such as Thomas Sowell believe that time has proven Moynihan's thesis that African-American poverty and the extent of violent crime in their communities were a prime result of the number of single-parent families.

Religious believers hold the biblical view that the nuclear family is the bedrock of a healthy society. To them, marriage between a man and a woman is God's method to support the consequences of the procreative potential of sex. They consider the two-parent family unit as the optimal environment for the care and nurture of children. This idea is based on the universal and enduring values created by God thousands of years ago (Genesis 1:28, 2:18, 2:24).

CVS, Walgreens announce plans to dispense abortion pill after Biden FDA loosens restriction

(LifeSiteNews) Jan. 6, 2023 – Following the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) loosening abortion pill distribution regulations, America's top pharmacy chains CVS and Walgreens announced their plans to dispense the lethal drugs. On Tuesday, the FDA updated its website to reflect new guidelines on abortion pill access, which now allows retail pharmacies to carry mifepristone which, used alongside misoprostol, causes the deaths of unborn babies at early stages of development. Shortly after, CVS and Walgreens, announced that their companies would be going through the process of certification in the hopes of being approved to dispense mifepristone.

Should CVS and Walgreens obtain the certification, Americans shopping for candy bars, toilet paper, or Tylenol at these familiar stores could soon be purchasing everyday items and medicines alongside pregnant women collecting pills prescribed to end the lives of their unborn children.

Pro-life leaders emphasized that in addition to killing unborn babies, these pills are also dangerous to the women taking them. Students for Life of America (SFLA), which had circulated a petition to "restore health and safety standards to chemical abortion pill regulations," declared that the FDA is deliberately ignoring the health risks for women who take mifepristone. "The FDA doesn't seem to care who dies after taking chemical abortion pills, as long as a baby's life is also ended," SFLA president Kristan Hawkins said in a Jan. 6 press release. "Even as the death count of women taking chemical abortion pills has gone up along with the distribution of these deadly drugs, they claim there is nothing new to consider. This reckless abuse of power makes it easier for abortion vendors to profit by ignoring the needs of women." Thousands have signed petitions threatening to boycott Walgreens and CVS if they proceed with their plans to distribute a pill that kills pre-born babies at the early stages of life (see this LifeSiteNews report of Jan. 6 to sign a petition).

Since the overturning of *Roe v. Wade*, a number of states have effectively banned abortion on demand throughout pregnancy. These states — whose laws would prevent CVS and Walgreens from distributing mifepristone within their borders — include **Wisconsin**, Texas, and Tennessee.
