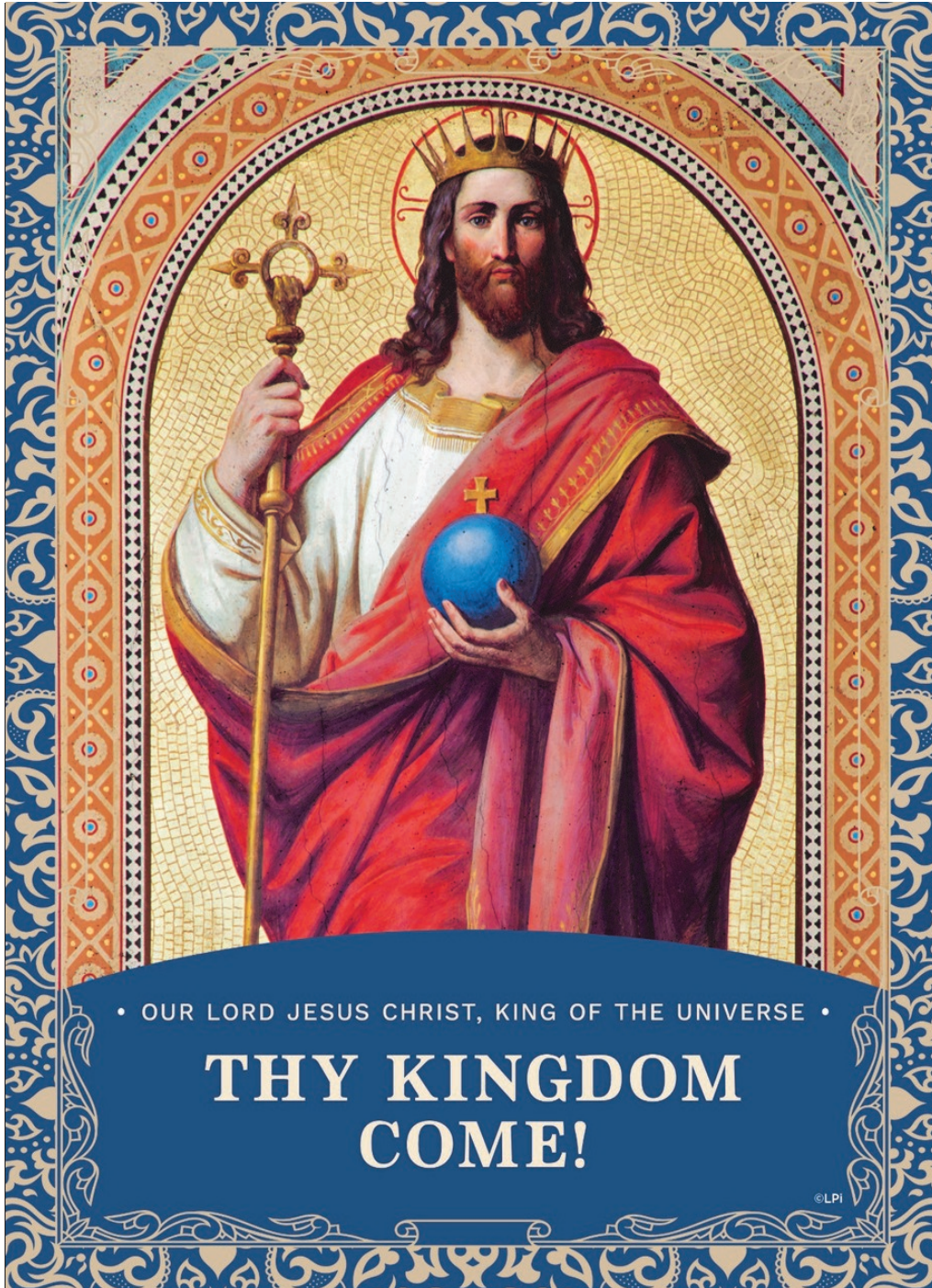

Catholic Replies

Q. I am glad that the president has restored Oct. 12 as Columbus Day and not Indigenous Peoples' Day. What was the rationale for displacing Columbus after centuries of celebrating his exploits in discovering the Americas?

A. The problem with Columbus, says historian Paul Kengor, is that he was a “dreaded DWEM (Dead White European Male),” who allegedly brought to this hemisphere “ disease, slavery, colonialism, imperialism, racism, sexism, ageism, homophobia, and whatever other litany they would like to cast at the feet of the villainous Columbus.”

Writing in the *American Spectator*, Kengor says that Columbus was a saint compared to the “Indigenous Peoples,” particularly the Cherokee, Chickasaw, Choctaw, Creek, and Seminole Indian tribes. He says that “these tribes owned thousands of black African slaves and were brutal slave masters. They were so dedicated to slave ownership that many sided with the Confederacy during the Civil War. To this day, there are African American descendants of these slaves with lawsuits against these indigenous tribes seeking redress. (See my book, *The Worst of Indignities: The Catholic Church on Slavery.*)” Kengor, who teaches at Grove City College, says that one of the worst of these slavers was Stand Watie (1806–1871), a powerful Cherokee leader who not only supported slavery but became a Confederate general. He resisted the Emancipation Proclamation and was the last Confederate general to surrender in the Civil War. Those who study history carefully and objectively, says Kengor, will learn the true history of early America, “from its discovery by the great Columbus to the *Mayflower* to the American Founders to the Civil War.” But those “in the government schools and lousy universities” will get only “ a selective, politically correct, ideologically sanitized account,” he says. A real education “ will teach you that the indigenous tribes of this land were not some perfect, pristine people living in peaceful harmony until the wretched Columbus marched in and ruined utopia.”
